Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 18. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious vehicle with occupants was investigated on East Drive. All parties were checked out and information was taken.
- Construction work was suspended at a North Drive home after it was discovered that there were no permits/permission for the work.
- A downed parking sign on Station Road was discovered and put by garage for safe keeping. Town of N. Hempstead notified.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A loose dog was located on Nassau Drive and Gilchrest Road. The animal was apprehended and returned to the owner without issue.
- A resident of Nassau Drive requested assistance with a lighting issue in the home. The situation was corrected without issue.
- A 911 hang up was investigated on Nassau Drive and found to be dialed in error.

- An open front door was observed while on patrol at a Nassau Drive home. The interior was checked and residents were on scene. All appears ok.

- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious incident was reported by a resident of Nassau Drive. A check of the premise and surrounding area produced negative results.
- A lost/suspicious backpack was located on Arleigh Road. The backpack was checked and the owner identified and bag returned.
- A report of an alarm ringing in vicinity of Beverly Road and West Drive. Police responded and checked area but were unable to locate any alarm ringing.
