Auto Accidents:

Miscellaneous:

- A 911 hang up was reported through NCPD dispatch at a Nassau Drive home. Upon arrival and speaking with homeowner, it was found to be dialed in error.
- A disabled resident of Beverly Road was assisted after a power outage caused uncomfortable conditions due to high temperatures and lack of power for medical equipment.
- Police responded to a complaint of a large group of youths in vicinity of Beverly/Gilchrest. Upon arrival it was found to be a group of three adults talking. Group dispersed voluntarily.
- A male pedestrian was asked to leave village gazebo after park hours. Subject seemed agitated but left voluntarily.
- A road crew in the village was assisted with heavy traffic while line painting in multiple locations.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A stop work order was enforced at a construction site in violation of village code ordered by the building inspector.
- Members of The Kensington Police Department participated in the NYS STEP enforcement initiative.
- A dispute between a taxi driver and passenger was mitigated on Beverly Road. Both parties agreed and to the terms and sent on their way
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious auto with occupants on North Drive was investigated. Identification was taken and vehicle was sent on way.
- A loose dog was located and returned to its owner on Beverly Road without incident.
- Kings Point Police and NCPD Ambulance were assisted with a violent metal aided on East Shore Road.
- An Arleigh Road resident was notified that their alarm was activated. They were aware of the issue which was caused by an electrical storm in the area.
- A suspicious male on Arleigh Road was reported by a passing motorist. No further information was given and a search of the area produced negative results.
- Assistance was given to NCPD with traffic control after a pedestrian was struck by a vehicle.
- A resident on Arleigh Road requested assistance after a flood in the basement due to heavy rains. The area was contained and contractors called to remedy situation.
