

Monthly Police Report

December 2018

Auto Accidents:

12/15-A two vehicle collision occurred on Park Road. Both vehicles were towed from scene. No injuries reported.

Aided Cases:

12/03-A resident of Stoner Avenue was transported to North Shore LIJ for an unknown issue. Nassau County Police Ambulance assisted with transport.

12/06-A resident of North Drive was assisted back into a chair after a fall in the home but refused any further medical attention.

12/25-A resident of Beverly Road suffering from shortness of breath and high blood pressure was evaluated at home by medical staff, but refused transport to the hospital.

Miscellaneous:

- A suspicious vehicle was reported on Beverly Road. Upon police arrival, it was determined to be a relative of a worker at a neighboring home waiting to pick them up.
- In an effort to combat package/mail thefts throughout the holiday season, unoccupied homes were checked multiple times daily and corrective action was taken as needed.
- A report of a young child running down West Drive was reported to police by a passing motorist. A check of West Drive and surrounding area produced negative results. NCPD and Great Neck Estates assisted with search.
- A manhole cover located on East Shore Road was found disconnected from the manhole. Police coned off hole and notified Nassau County Highway Department of issue.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious van driving back and forth on Beverly Road was reported by a pedestrian. Police located van and questioned driver. Proper id and cause were given to police and verified. Motorist was released and given proper directions.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Police observed a large amount of shattered glass on Nassau Drive from an unknown source. Highway department was notified and responded to clean up debris.
- An open garage door on North Drive was observed while on patrol. The owner was notified and advised that it was left open in error and will return to secure door.
- A solicitor was observed while on patrol and advised of village ordinances/permit. Subject left voluntarily and will apply for permit in the future.
- An open front door was observed at a home on Arleigh Road. Police located the owner upstairs who was unaware of the issue. A search of the home was completed and all appeared ok.
- Police observed construction workers at a construction site on Arleigh Road. Workers at site were previously advised of village ordinance regarding weekend work. All workers were advised to leave and a summons was issued.
- Police responded to a Nassau Drive home at the request of village hall to get information from new owner. Residence was unoccupied at the time and police will monitor for activity.
- Police responded to a Beverly Road home to answer questions regarding a new local law.
- A neighbor dispute was adjudicated by police on Arleigh Road. Both parties were spoken to as to the proper solution.
- A 911 hang up was reported by Nassau County PD at an Arleigh Road home. Upon arrival it was found to be dialed in error by an 8-year-old child in the home.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on Arleigh Road and East Shore Road. Situation was corrected.
- Police assisted in an exchange of information after two vehicles had a minor collision on West Drive and Nassau Drive. No injuries reported
- An American Express credit card was found on Middle Neck Road by police. Credit card company would not contact owner of card but did freeze account from further use.
- Police were called to an Arleigh Road home after a vehicle was backing out of the driveway and brushed up against a pedestrian. There were no injuries at scene and both parties refused a report.
- A downed light pole was observed while on patrol in front of an Arleigh Road home. Pole was coned off for safety and highway department was notified to respond.
