

# Monthly Police Report

January 2019

## Auto Accidents:

1/14- A vehicle drove off the roadway and struck a tree at the intersection of North Drive and Gilchrest Road. Vehicle was towed from scene and driver was removed to North Shore Hospital as a precaution due to airbag deployment.

1/15- A two vehicle collision occurred on East Shore Road while attempting to merge. No aided and no tow required.

1/18- A two vehicle collision occurred on Arleigh Road. No injuries were sustained and no tow required.

1/20- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Arleigh Road and West Drive. No injuries. No tow.

1/29- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Gilchrest Road and Beverly Road. Both vehicles towed from scene and one occupant was checked by EMS at scene but refused any further medical assistance.

## Aided Cases:

1/03- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from severe weakness for several days.

1/09- A resident of Nassau Drive was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering a nose bleed at home.

1/10- A resident of Beverly Road was pronounced at the home after being found unresponsive by a family member.

1/13- A resident of an Arleigh Road home was assisted back into a chair after a fall in the home. No injuries were reported and aided refused any further medical assistance.

1/14- A Great Neck resident was transported to North Shore Hospital as a precautionary measure after being involved in a motor vehicle accident with airbag deployment.

1/14- A guest of a Beverly Road resident was transported to North Shore Hospital with pain from a fall the previous day.

1/27- An Uber driver was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering an eye injury while exiting his vehicle on Beverly Road.

1/28- An Arleigh Road resident was assisted into a wheelchair after sliding off at home. No injuries were sustained during the fall and aided refused any further medical attention.

## Ambulance Calls:

### Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

### Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 24. All were found to be secure.

### Miscellaneous:

- Police were called to respond to a flooding condition just outside Kensington jurisdiction. Problem was found to be caused by a construction site on Arleigh Road. The GC was notified and situation was corrected. No damage. Building Dept/inspector also notified.
- A dispute between a prior resident and current owner was resolved. Complaint involved a civil matter and both parties advised to seek counsel.
- A suspicious vehicle was reported on North Drive. Vehicle and occupant were located and identified. Person was conducting business in the area but voluntarily left scene.
- A disabled motorist was assisted on Nassau Drive and Clifford Lane. Situation corrected.
- A complaint of a vehicle driving erratically on Nassau Drive was reported to NCPD 911 and forwarded to Kensington. A check of Nassau Drive and the surrounding area produced negative results.
- A resident was assisted with information after a equipment failure caused the home to be without adequate heat during a dangerous cold spell.
- Police were requested to respond to 1 Kensington Gate for a welfare check by the superintendent of the building. The apartment was empty and after speaking with a friend of the resident, it was found that the resident checked into the hospital the week prior for a medical procedure.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- Police assisted a resident of Beverly Road with a civil issue. The issue was corrected.
- A report of a suspicious male in the rear yard of an Arleigh Road home was investigated. The male was located and identified as a National Grid employee, proper ID.
- A passing motorist reported that the traffic signal light at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR was operating incorrectly. Police responded to manually direct traffic until repair company responded to scene.
- A disabled motorist was assisted with a flat tire on Nassau Drive. Police were able to change tire with spare and motorist was advised to replace tire.
- A resident of Arleigh Road was assisted after being locked out of home. Access was gained without damage.
- Police responded to Park Road after receiving complaint of a dangerous traffic condition. The situation will be evaluated and suggestions given to village board at the next meeting.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Property was located and returned to an Arleigh Road resident
- A suspicious person crouched behind bushes at a Nassau Drive home was observed while on patrol. The subject was stopped and id and purpose verified. All Ok and subject was released from scene.
- Police responded to a Beverly Road home after a report of a Life Alert activation. Upon arrival it was determined to be activated in error.
- Police responded to a tree blocking the roadway on Arleigh Road. The roadway was blocked off to traffic by police and highway department notified and responded to remove tree and clear roadway.
