

Monthly Police Report

February 2019

Auto Accidents:

02/11- A resident of Nassau Drive unintentionally hit the accelerator while pulling into garage causing damage to vehicle and home. Driver was treated at scene for chest pains but refused any further medical attention or transport to hospital.

02/12- A one vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road/Nassau Drive. The vehicle slid into a tree due to inclement weather. No injuries and vehicle was towed from scene.

Aided Cases:

02/11- A Beverly Road resident was transported to North Shore Hospital after being found unresponsive in the home.

02/15- A patient of 192 East Shore Road was transported to North Shore Hospital by Manhasset-Lakeville after suffering from weakness and nausea.

02/27- A resident of Beverly Road was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering symptoms of the flu.

Ambulance Calls:

The Department responded to 7 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

Cases:

Fires:

- Kensington Police were requested to assist the Great Neck Estates and Nassau County Police to secure a crime scene stemming from a burglary that just occurred and subject apprehended.
- After several complaints from neighbors, a resident on Nassau Drive was spoken to regarding village ordinances involving garbage. Resident will comply voluntarily and was unaware of the violations.
- Police were called to a Nassau Drive home to intervene in a dispute between two family members. The situation was arbitrated by police and a report was taken at scene
- An open door at a vacant home was observed while on patrol. Police checked interior and exterior, all appearing in order. The door was secured after home was checked.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- Police responded to a medical alert alarm at 1 Kensington Gate. Upon arrival it was found that the owner was testing alarm and there was no emergency.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- A Beverly Road resident requested police to assist with the removal of a wild animal inside the home. The animal was removed by police. No damage.
- A 911 hang up was investigated at a home on Nassau Drive. It was found that it was dialed in error.
- A report was taken from a Sutton Court resident after the victim was scammed out of money by someone posing as PSE&G representative. NCPD Detectives notified.
- Damage to village property occurred while police were responding to an emergency call. All notifications were completed, and damage repaired. No injuries were sustained.
- A resident was assisted on Nassau Drive after becoming locked out of the vehicle. Entry was gained. No damage
