## Auto Accidents:

## Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 11. All were found to be secure.

## Miscellaneous:

- NCPD and GNEPD were assisted with traffic at the intersection of Linden Blvd and MNR after a vehicle emitting smoke from the engine bay was tended to by Vigilant FD
- A large group of youths were observed at the corner of Nassau Drive and West Drive. Group got lost while attempting to find a friend's home. Sent on way.
- Police were requested to respond to an apartment at 1 Kensington Gate to check on the welfare of an elderly resident. The resident's daughter reported being unable to contact her mother. Police responded and located resident in good health and advised to call daughter.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A suspicious vehicle with 2 occupants were stopped and questioned after officer observed them circling the block several times. Subjects were unable to provide ID and had no documentation for vehicle. Language barrier present. All possible information was recorded and subjects sent on way.
- Noise complaints at a construction site on North Drive were addressed with the workers and general contractor. Will comply going forward.
- A loose dog on Sutton Court was located and returned to owner without incident.
- A resident of Nassau Drive requests police to check interior of home after hearing footsteps. Interior was checked with negative results. All ok.
- A 911 hang up was reported at an Arleigh Road home. Police responded and spoke with resident. All was ok, dialed in error.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- While on patrol, police observed the front door of a Beverly Road home wide open. Residents were contacted and responded. Door was not properly closed by guest of home. Interior checked and all appeared in order.
- Several residents were advised to move vehicles from roadway due to impending storm. All complied and roads were cleared for plows to operate.
- A resident of Nassau Drive reported being locked out of home. Police were able to gain entry with key on file.
