

Monthly Police Report

October 2019

Auto Accidents:

10/16- A two vehicle collision occurred at the intersection of Beverly Road and MNR. No injuries. No tow.

Aided Cases:

10/10-Police and medical responded to a medical alert at 1 Kensington Gate. Upon arrival it was determined to be a false signal. No assistance needed by resident.
10/11- A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was treated at home after suffering from difficulty breathing. Aided refused transport and any further medical assistance.
10/12-A resident of 1 Kensington Gate was transported to North Shore Hospital after suffering from high blood pressure and general illness
10/24-While on patrol police observed a male slumped over the steering wheel. Aided was confused and disorientated. Aided transported to North Shore Hospital for possible stroke or dementia.
10/29- A Beverly Road resident was transported to North Shore LIJ after suffering a possible seizure at home.

Ambulance Calls:

The Vigilant Fire Company Ambulance responded to all of the above aided cases.

The Department responded to 7 active alarms during the month, all were found to be false burglar alarms.

Fires:

10/02- Vigilant Fire Company responded to a home on Arleigh Road in response to a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be set off by workers soldering in attic. No damage.
10/24-Vigilant Fire Company responded to a home on Beverly Road in response to a fire alarm. Upon arrival it was determined to be a faulty alarm. No damage.

Larcenies:

Nothing to report.

Vacant Homes:

The number of homes reported vacant during the month was 12. All were found to be secure.

Miscellaneous:

-Police responded to a report of tree down into a building on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival police observed that a large tree limb had fallen through a detached garage roof causing damage to the structure and a vehicle inside the garage at the time. PSE&G and Vigilant FD notified and responded to scene.
-Highway department notified of a tree blocking the roadway on Arleigh Road and Kensington Court due to high winds.
-Police responded to Arleigh Road after a witness reported observing a motorist leave the scene after striking a light pole. Information was gathered and the subject was notified to

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respond to the scene. All information was taken and a summons was issued. All paperwork forwarded to court personnel.

- Police were called to respond to a suspicious vehicle w/occupants on the corner of Nassau Drive and East Drive. Upon arrival the vehicle described by complainant was gone. A check of the area produced negative results.
- Assistance was given to a motorist on the corner of Nassau Drive and East Shore Road. The issue was corrected and motorist was sent on way.
- A lost dog was recovered on Beverly Road with no tags. NCPD and GNEPD notified to leave information in case owner contacted them. Shortly after, the owner was located and dog returned.
- A suspicious vehicle with occupant was reported on Arleigh Road. Police responded and located vehicle. Subject was waiting to pick up a friend at location. Story verified and subject paperwork returned.
- A Beverly Road resident was assisted back into home after being locked out. Key on file used to gain entry.
- Police observed a home on North Drive having extensive work performed by a contractor without proper permits. Building Department notified and requested police to stop all work until further notice.
- Police responded to the parking garage at 1 Kensington Gate to assist a resident having difficulty getting from vehicle to elevator. The situation was resolved. No injury reported.
- Temporary No Parking signs were deployed throughout the village in order to alleviate possible traffic /parking conditions.
- Light outages/issues were reported throughout the month to the village hall for repair.
- A tree came down during a storm in the rear yard of a North Drive home. The tree struck the home and utilities causing a hazardous condition. PSE&G notified as well as National Grid for a gas shut off.
- Police took a report at a Nassau Drive home for a resident that fell on the sidewalk. Accident occurred a week prior to police being notified. A report was taken for documentation.
- A report was taken in reference to a resident of Great Neck who was unable to locate his mobility scooter after leaving it on Beverly Road.
- Police provided an escort and closed off several roads within the village for a resident involved in a religious event.
- Police responded to a Range Rover SOS alert on Arleigh Road. Upon arrival it was determined that the owner pressed the button in error.
- An Arleigh Road resident contacted police with concerns about a National Grid subcontractor trying to gain access to the home. Police contacted contractor who was duly licensed under National Grid, but had the incorrect address written on the work order. Homeowner notified of outcome.
