Miscellaneous:

- Police responded to an Arleigh Road home for a report of possible trespasser at scene. Upon arrival the subject was located and identified as a landscaper that had done work at the home and was dropping off a bill.
- A loose dog was secured on Nassau Drive. The dog was identified by tags on the collar and returned to owner.
- A Beverly Road resident was assisted into home after being locked out. Vigilant Fire Company also assisted to gain entry.
- An elderly female was brought to police HQ by a passing motorist to report that she was unable to locate her car. Vehicle was located without issue.
- Resident of Stoner Ave reports suspicious activity found on ring camera. After speaking with resident and viewing footage, the suspicious activity was unable to be resolved. Police will monitor the situation going forward.
- An open/unsecured gate was investigated at a business on East Shore Road. A person on scene was located and identified as an employee working extra hours. No criminality observed.
- Police responded to a Beverly Road home after homeowner heard banging noises coming from side door. Upon arrival, police conducted a canvass with negative results. It was observed that the screen door was unsecured and swinging open and closed from the wind which was most likely the cause of the noise.
- Police responded to 1 Kensington Gate for a report of an activated Life Alert panic button. The owner of the Life Alert button was located and the alarm was triggered in error.
- A medical alert activation was investigated at a Beverly Road home and found to be set in error.
